




ICS International Painting Competition

Cashless Economy: Boon or Bane

“Monetary transactions are the lifelines of economy.”

The salient feature of various dominant economies like U. S. A., China and Canada is an unconventional system of digital or cashless transactions. It allows instant transactions and borderless transfer of ownership. Following the footsteps of developed nations, India is also striving to build a cashless economy.

In any economy, the needs of the consumers are of paramount importance. A cashless economy system makes it very convenient for people and business houses to transfer money to another entity. For a layman, it reduces the tediousness of carrying a large quantity of paper notes. In hospitals and emergency situations, monetary liabilities can be settled easily through internet banking without an actual physical presence of money. The government also provides incentives in the form of discounts to the customers for rail travel [2%] and service tax [0.75%] etc. It also allows the government to monitor and mend tax evasion. Since no online transaction goes unrecorded, the government can track unscrupulous activities, accumulation of 'black money' and funding of terror activities. In 2012-13, 2,376 crore were spent in India to print currency notes, which constitutes 1.5% of total money printed. Thus, following the mandate of 'CASHLESS, CORRUPTIONLESS, PAPERLESS', we are reducing the government's expenditure. In addition to this, we can also eliminate the menace of counterfeit currency in the economy.

This digital alternative also has other advantages. In case one gets robbed in a foreign country, one would not face as much inconvenience as we would be relying mainly on digital currency which can be tracked easily. It lowers the risk of theft as cards and

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

Significance of Kargil Day

'Good men must die, but death cannot kill their names.'

India has been referred to and revered as the 'Golden Bird' since times immemorial. This Golden Bird does not allow any invaders to encroach its nest. The victory of the brave Indian Army in the Kargil War was indeed a spectacular tribute to patriotism. This war resulted in massive destruction of life and property for both countries. Kargil Day owes its significance to paying homage to the undefeated courage of the martyred, yet immortalized heroes of this war.

Back in the late 1990s, India and Pakistan had a mutual agreement to vacate the battle fields in the extremely high altitude regions of Kashmir and Sikkim during severe winter. Later, when a patrol unit was sent to investigate, the unit was reported missing after some days. They could track Indian movements from a higher altitude while Indians couldn't even obtain an iota of information about their foe's numbers or their weapons. The battle took place near Siachen Glacier, the highest battle field of the world.

Under the guidance of the then Prime Minister, Late Shri Atal



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
